

Management And Union Co-operation Urged By A. F. of L.

MIAMI, Fla.—A resolution on the extension of cooperation between labor unions and management introduced at the 1940 convention of the American Federation of Labor was discussed by the A. F. of L. Executive Council at its mid-winter meeting here. The resolution, sponsored by several unions active in the railway industry, directed Mr. Green to create a committee "to plan for a service agency to counsel union management undertakings."

The resolution was not adopted by the convention but was referred to the Executive Council, which directed

the Federation officers to confer with those interested in furthering cooperation between unions and management. The officers were requested to obtain all information possible and to report at the spring meeting of the Council in Washington.

In connection with this resolution, Mr. Green explained that a union-management cooperation plan on the Baltimore & Ohio Railroad had been furthered by the railroad unions, under direction of Otto S. Beyer, an engineer, now a member of the National Mediation Board.

Police-Firemen Civil Service Bill Is Sidetracked


A group of Charlotte policemen and firemen attended the session of the House committee on counties, cities, and towns Tuesday when the bill of the Wake delegation to set up civil service systems in cities over 30,000 population was called. The measure was given an unfavorable report and will not be revived this year.

Upwards of 60 residents of Charlotte and Mecklenburg were present this afternoon for public hearings on the bitterly contested, State wage-hour and anti-sabotage bills. Both sides of each question were well represented.

Meanwhile, Chairman James B. Vogler is deferring committee consideration on the bill which would permit the Charlotte city council to name a chief of police from without the department. Vogler said this afternoon that to date he had received no formal request for a public hearing on the bill. If none is lodged during the next day or so, he will first consult with his colleagues before taking any action. If no decisive public interest develops one way or the other, the measure may be permitted to die of suffocation in a committee pigeon hole.—Observer Special, Wednesday.

Good News To Dieters



If you are one of those dieters who fears that ice cream may be fattening, yet finds it difficult to resist your favorite dessert on a hot day, you will be interested in this little story and its recipe.

It deals with an ice cream that contains three times as much milk and orange juice as cream, without sacrificing any of its rich, full flavor and smoothness. The deceptively expensive-looking parfait pictured consists of this ice cream, combined with a lengthwise slice of banana, a dab of whipped cream, a trickle of whipped currant jelly and a cherry. If you are very, very sensitive about your weight you may even eliminate the whipped cream.

This rennet-custard ice cream is smooth and full-flavored in spite of the fact that it is made without eggs and with approximately one-fourth of the total liquid in the form of cream — half to one-eighth as much cream as is usually used. It requires no cooking, is easily digested and has a much lower caloric value than the usual tasty of this type.

Follow these simple directions and you'll have a dessert that will delight—whether you are a dieter or not:

- Orange Banana Parfait
2 rennet tablets
2 tablespoons cold water
1½ cups heavy cream

- 2½ cups milk (ordinary or homogenized)
1 cup sugar
1½ cup orange juice, strained
4 teaspoons lemon juice, strained
¼ teaspoon grated orange rind
3 bananas

Crush and dissolve rennet tablets in cold water in a cup. Warm cream, milk and sugar slowly, stirring constantly. Test a drop on inside of wrist frequently. When comfortably warm, (120° F.) not hot, remove at once from stove. Add dissolved rennet tablets and stir quickly for a few seconds only. Pour at once, while still liquid, into freezer can and let stand at room temperature until firm and cool. Pack in a mixture of 4 parts ice to 1 part ice cream salt and freeze until mushy. Open can and slowly add fruit juices and grated rind, turning dasher to prevent mixture from hardening on outside. Replace cover and crank and finish freezing until stiff. Remove dasher. Repack with ice and salt and let set until ready to serve.

Serve in well-chilled parfait glasses. Cut lengthwise slices of ripe banana and coil diagonally around inside of glass. Fill with ice cream and top with a dab of whipped cream and a sauce made by whipping currant jelly until it can be poured. Cap with a maraschino cherry if desired. (If you do not have parfait glasses, use ordinary sherbets.) Serves 10.
