

AFL Group Plans To Meet In June Regarding Palestine Aid

New York City—More than 300 day National Trade Union Emergencies Conference on Labor Palestine delegates of labor unions from every part of the United States and Canada will meet at a three-

month, with William Green, President of the American Federation of Labor, as principal speaker.

The conference is being called to express the solidarity of American labor with the Palestinian Jewish Federation of Labor, in its work of building Palestine and turning the desert sands into the biblical "land of milk and honey."

The AFL, as well as many international unions, and state and city central bodies, has gone on record repeatedly demanding that Great Britain, the mandatory power in Palestine, honor the terms of its mandate, and permit the free entry of Jews into Palestine. Recently they have urged the carrying out of President Truman's recommendation that 100,000 survivors of the Nazi extermination camps be permitted to enter Palestine immediately.

Organized labor's sympathy with the aspirations of the Jewish people to build Palestine into a free and democratic homeland is especially deep because of the important part played in the building of Palestine by the Palestine Federation of Labor—known as the Histadrut.

Histadrut, with 170,000 members, who together with their families make up over 40 per cent of the Jewish population of Palestine, plays a determining part in the Palestinian economy.

(Continued from Page 1) Employers resisting wage increases and collective bargaining courts began confiscating workers' homes with triple damages required under antitrust law because of union activity. Workers' right to collective action in order to make effective their rights possessed as individuals had to be written into public policy—the right to quit work collectively, the right to collective contracts specifying terms and

conditions of work, and the right to promote their economic welfare.

Strong and effective unions have supplemented political democracy by assuring economic rights for the numerical majority of our citizens and enabling them to assume responsibilities for their own welfare. Unions take pride in the fact that the workers of this country, while loyal to our democracy, are also known throughout the world as the most efficient and most resourceful work force in the world. The United States leads the world in technical progress and has a work force with corresponding work ability. All this because we are the freest workers in the world—free through our unions and national opportunities.

These facts and these achievements we submit to our nation as reason why oppressive, punitive legislation should not be enacted to throttle the unions which have had an integral part in the development of our national life and democratic institutions and must have an effective role and responsibility in promoting democratic institutions in the organization of international relationships. Upon the decision of our policy for free unions at home

rests our nation's authority to claim world leadership in the promotion of freedom for all other countries."

PIEDMONT

The music Piedmont farmers favor these days is the clank of tools and material daily extending electric service to new farms.
