POLITICAL WRANGLE IN SENATE DEFERS VOTE ON NLRB JOBS

Washington, D. C.—A political wrangle engaged in by the Senate during the final hours of its closing session prevented a final vote on President Truman's nominations to fill new NLRB jobs created by the Taft-Hartley law.

Mr. Truman appointed former Senator Abe Murdock of Utah and J. Copeland Gray of Buffalo to new positions on the National Labor Relations Board. He chose Robert N. Denham, NLRB trial examiner, to serve as general counsel of the board.

Thus the Senate, which had the last word to say on the new anti-labor measure, failed to confirm the men designated to play an important part in the administration of the new law. This will serve only to cloud the already complicated situation and will delay the reorganization on a permanent basis of the NLRB.

The way was paved for Senate action when the Senate Labor Committee approved the President's appointments. It voted unanimously in favor of Mr. Denham for the new position of general counsel. The vote was 9 to 3 in favor of Murdock and Gray.

AFL-CIO ELECTIONS CLOSE; MAJORITY ELIGIBLES VOTING

Washington, D. C.—Seventy-four per cent of the ballots cast during June in elections conducted by the National Labor Relations Board were in favor of collective bargaining by some labor organization.

The NLRB report showed a nip and tuck race between the AFL and CIO in the number of elections won. The AFL was victorious in 147 elections, or 52 per cent of those in which it participated, while the CIO won out on 107 occasions with a percentage score of 55 per cent.

Contests pitting the AFL and CIO directly against each other resulted in 24 AFL victories as against 32 wins chalked up by the CIO.

The 864 cases filed with NLRB in June represented a decrease of 38 per cent from the number filed in June a year ago. The backlog of cases still to be completed is, however, 10 per cent greater than the figure for June, 1946. At the end of last month, 5,073 cases were awaiting action at various procedural levels.

A total of 431 elections were conducted during the month with 54,063 ballots cast. This represented 87 per cent of those eligible to vote.

AFL HOTEL EMPLOYEES GAIN WAGE INCREASE

New York City.—The AFL's Hotel Front Service Employees Union, Local 144, representing some 2,000 members, obtained gains in its new contract with the Associated Hotel & Residence Clubs, Inc.

Wage increases granted by the association average about 22 per cent. The new wage scales provide four hourly rates ranging from 70 cents to more than \$1 an hour. Wage adjustments are retroactive to April 1, 1947.



ATTENTION GAS CUSTOMERS DURING GAS CHANGE-OVER PLEASE FOLLOW THESE INSTRUCTIONS

- 1 AUTOMATIC WATER HEATERS AND RANGES WITH AUTOMATIC OVEN LIGHTING—All such heaters and ranges known to be on our lines have been equipped with 100% shut-off valves. If you have an appliance not so equipped, or if you are in doubt, close both main burner and pilot valves and call the gas service department.
2 MANUALLY OPERATED RANGES AND WATER HEATERS—Do not use the oven or broiler under any circumstances. The top burners may be used by turning them to about one-half normal (see drawing below).
3 REFRIGERATORS—The Servel-Electrolux gas refrigerator must be turned to the defrosting position until conversion man arrives.
4 VENTILATION—In case a gas odor is detected, ventilate immediately, especially in the kitchen.
