NLRB EXAMINER SAYS TAFT-HARTLEY LAW AFFECTS LOCAL HOME BUILDING INDUSTRY

interstate commerce was not involved.

However, when that law was succeeded by the Labor Management Relations (Taft-Hartley) Act, Robert N. Denham, general counsel, ruled that the industry, generally speaking, would come within the board's scope of operations. The new law give the board jurisdiction over cases that "affect commerce."

Mr. Bellman's finding amounts to a recommendation which becomes a board order unless it is protested by the parties involved within 20 days. In this event, the NLRB itself might review the case.

The union, the Port Chester

(N. Y.) local of the AFL's International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers contended that the Federal agency lacked jurisdiction in the Greenwich case, and urged the board, whatever its finding, not to accept jurisdiction because of "the small gross annual business" of the contractor involved.

Mr. Bellman said that Samuel Langer of Port Chester, the subcontractor, had bought materials and performed work for many concerns directly engaged in interstate commerce.

But after ruling against the union on the point of jurisdiction, the NLRB examiner dismissed charges of unfair labor practices against the AFL local. The charge was that the union had exercised illegal restraint and coercion on the Greenwich job and had conducted an unlawful secondary boycott against
