**AFL SEAFARERS Tell It to Congress**

...mire him. He possesses, to a high degree, the happy combination of high idealism and practical wisdom that makes for enduring success. His unwavering integrity, his sound judgment and his clear vision have served your brotherhood and our nation well. For he has been the adviser and confidante of Presidents and other national leaders. He has wielded a constructive influence over the political life of our country. And his contributions to the trade-union movement as a whole, both at the national and international level, are so great that I want to say to you here and now that the American Federation of Labor owes a debt of gratitude to the Brotherhood of Railway and Steamship Clerks for letting us have George Harrison even part of the time.

"We in the labor movement always look ahead. Let me emphasize that we have much to hope for and to work for in 1950. Our hopes are based upon the prosperous condition of our country which offers us new opportunities to consolidate our gains and lift the standard of living of our membership and the American people as a whole to new heights.

"Our work must be concentrated on two fronts:

"First, it is our duty and our very reason for existence to organize the unorganized. The American Federation of Labor is preparing to launch a sweeping organizing drive during the coming year with a goal of a million new members in 1950. To my mind that would be the most fitting way we can celebrate the centennial of the father of the organized labor movement in our country, Samuel Gompers.

"Secondly, we must and we shall expand our political activities with the objective of electing a new Congress next November that will be truly liberal and progressive. The reactionary forces in our coun-

try are leaving no stone unturned in their drive to discredit and besmirch the record of Franklin D. Roosevelt and his successor Harry S. Truman. They want to tear down everything that we have helped to build up to protect the welfare of the American people in the last 18 years. They want to make certain that the Taft-Hartley Act will be retained, so that they can renew their efforts to destroy the labor movement with the help of the federal government whenever an opportune time arrives."
