

Senator Frank P. Graham was the top man in the North Carolina senatorial race in the Primary election on May 27 by over 50,000 votes. The next highest man was Willis Smith of Raleigh, who campaigned hard throughout the State against Mr. Graham, raising the racial and communism issues against the former president of the University of North Carolina.

Frank Graham's boyhood home of Charlotte now indicates that it will give him many more votes from Meck lenburg than he received in the primary as the result of the elimination of Robert R. Reynolds of Asheville.


