Dear Sir: Recently I was called upon by President Fink of the North Carclina State Federation of Labor, to protest in the name of the American Federation of Labor against the appointment of Da Ralph Brimley, Superintendent of Schools of Forysth County, North Carolina, to a mission to instruct Japanese in democratic education.

I was advised that the opposition of the organized labor movement of North Carolina to the appointment of Dr. Brimley was based upon the fact that when a teachers union was organized in the district where Dr. Brimley serves, he threatened these teachers with (1) he would not give them a second chance after they had made their first mistake; (2) he would not recommend them to jobs in other counties if they had been active in the Union in Forsyth County: (3) he would not appoint union teachers to administrative positions. All these threats were made publicly.

In view of this biased attitude of Dr. Brimley to union teachers and to the unionization of teachers, I voice to you my personal and official protest in the name and behalf of the American Federation of Labor, against the appointment of Dr. Ralph Brimley to serve on a mission to instruct Japanese in democratic education. 
