PRICES PERCHED AT ALL-TIME HIGH

New York.—Prices reached an all-time high last month, the National Industrial Conference Board reported.

Food, housing, sundries, and fuel forced the purchasing power of the dollar, compared with the 1939 dollar, down to 55.8 cents. Its value stood at 57.6 cents a year ago, the board said.

The board made its report shortly after Congress weakened the anti-inflationary controls law.
