A LITTLE HISTORY WITH SOME CONCLUSIONS.

REVIEW OF THE FIELD.

Some sixty eight years ago, when the republic was less than fifty years old, when the total vote cast in the whole United States by the States voting for President was 352,062, or less than will be cast in New York and Brooklyn this year, and when the whole number of States was twenty-four, and the population of the States and Terri tories was 9,800,000 a presidential election was thrown into the House of Representatives and there decided.

There were on that historical oc-

easion four candidates for President.

They represented the views and purposes of voters seperated at that period by sectional, rather than by political differences. Adams was strong in New York and New England. He had 77 electoral votes in New York and New England, and 7 from the other States of the country. Clay was supported by Kentucky and Ohlo, neighbors on the Ohio, but outside of these two States he received only 7 electoral votes. William Crawford, of Georga, had the 9 electoral votes of that State, the 24 of Virginia, and 1 from Maryland. Apart from these votes he had 7 scattering.
