In Davidson county near the Friedberg Moravian church, there lives one of the best farmers in North Carolina. He was in to see us the other day, and made the following statement:

"I made only half a crop of wheat this year owing the fact that I used no fertilizer, and my wheat was backward in the spring, a freeze injuring it. I planted 7 bushels of seed on 7 acres, and threshed 148. My land is in such a condition that I can make from 15 to 20 bushels to the acre on any of it without fertilizer. I am cutting my hay now, which comes out of my wheatfield. The stubble goes to my manure pile and the grass to my stock I have no meadow in the bottoms at all. My hay is made on upland and is always clean and of first quality. I planted one barrel of Irish potatoes this year, and dug from the same 40 bushels! Any man that says that farming don't pay, just simply doesn't know what he is talking about."

Poor, poor farmer!
Away over in Broadway township there is another. We knew him years ago when life was a continual struggle and hard-ship was his lot. But he put his brains to work, and see: Last year he sold \$625 worth of tobacco, raised 150 bushels of corn, 60 bushels of wheat, Irish and sweet potatoes and garden "sass" of every kind, put up his own meat, and averaged \$5 a week during the season trucking vegetables to town. He owns 56 acres, woodland and all, and has one horse. This year he has as fine a tobacco crop as he ever had, wheat not quite as good, other crops fair. On the edge of his tobacco patch he has one stalk which he makes his study, and every detail of its growth has been watched and remembered. This farmer lives in a cosy home, situated in a thrifty and prosperous neighborhood. He is enthusiastic about his cordial relations with town people, especially tobacco buyers. When he leaves Forsyth county, he says, it will be feet first and the breath gone out of his body.

Poor, poor farmer!
We are very happy to reckon these two farmers as close personal friends and are proud of their success.

When it comes to intensive farming and hearty, whole-souled soil-tillers, why, our woods are full of them.

DEMOCRATIC PLATFORM

The following is the State Democratic platform as adopted by the State convention assembled May 18:

RESOLVED, 1. That the democracy of North Carolina reaffirm the principles of the democratic party, both State and National, and particularly favor the free coinage of silver and an increase of the currency, and the repeal of the internal revenue system. And we denounce the McKinley tariff bill as unjust to the consumers of the country, and leading to the formation of trusts, combines and monopolies which have oppressed the people; and especially do we denounce the unnecessary and burdensome increase in the tax on cotton ties and on tin, so largely used by the poorer portion of the people. We likewise denounce the iniquitous force bill, which is not yet abandoned by the republican party, but is being urged as a measure to be adopted as soon as they regain control of the House of Representatives, the purpose and effect of which measure will be to establish a second period of reconstruction in the Southern States, to subvert the liberties of our people and inflame a new race antagonism and sectional animosities.

2. That we demand financial reform, and the enactment of laws that will remove the burden of the people relative to the existing agricultural depression, and do full and ample justice to the farmers and laborers of our country.

3. That we demand the abolition of national banks, and the substitution of legal tender treasury notes in lieu of national bank notes, issued in sufficient volume to do the business of the country on a cash system, regulating the amount needed on a per capita basis as the business interests of the country expand, and that all money issued by the government shall be legal tender in payment of all debts, both public and private.

4. That we demand that Congress shall pass such laws as shall effectually prevent the dealing in futures of all agricultural and mechanical productions; providing such stringent system of procedure in trials as shall secure prompt conviction and imposing such penalties as shall secure most perfect compliance with the law.

5. That we demand the free and unlimited coinage of silver.

6. That we demand the passage of laws prohibiting the alien ownership of land, and that Congress take early steps to devise some plan to obtain all lands now owned by alien and foreign syndicates; and that all lands now held by railroads and corporations, in excess of such as is actually used and needed by them, be reclaimed by the government and held for actual settlers only.

7. Believing in the doctrine of "equal rights to all and special privileges to none," we demand that taxation, national or State, shall not be used to build up one interest or class at the expense of another. We believe that the money of the country should be kept as much as possible in the hands of the people, and hence we demand that all revenue, national, State or county, shall be limited to the necessary expenses of the government economically and honestly administered.

8. That Congress issue a sufficient amount of fractional paper currency to facilitate the exchange through the medium of the United States mail.

RESOLVED, That the General Assembly pass such laws as will make the public school system more effective than the blessings of education may be extended to all the people of the State alike.

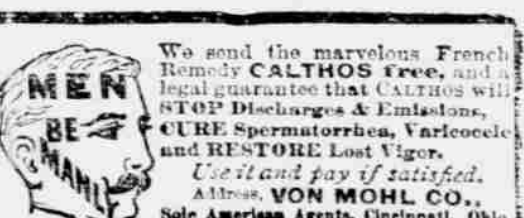

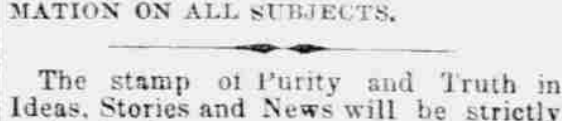
