#### YAWN:NG.

From the German of Mr. Julius Stinde. According to current ideas, vaweing in good society is an improper sign of weariness; seconding to the teach ings of physiology, it is a longdrawn, forcible inspiration; accord ing to Dr. Naegeli it is one of Nature's many remedies, the proper application of which depends upon good jadgement.

In yawning, not only the muscleswhich move the lower jaw are used but also the breathing muscles of the chest, and he who yawns to his heart's content also raises and extends the arms. In the deepest inpiration the chest remains extended for a short time, the eyes are ab most or entirely closed, the ears somewhat raised, nostrile dilated. Insula the mouth the tongue becomes round and arched, palate stiffly stretched, and the avula is raised, almost entirely closing the space between the nose and throat. At the beginning of the Inspiration a cracking nose is heard in the ears, a proof that the duct leading to the hearing also succumbs to this stretebing.

If the yawning has reached the deepest point it will require from one to one and a half seconds for it to become noticeable to the hearing, In order to observe this, let one place himself at a sufficient distance from a clock, so that its ricking will not be easily hard, and viwa deep ! ly. During this deep breathing the sound of the clock is not preceptible to the most careful listening. All this simply goes to show that yawn ing sets a number of muscles to work, and particularly those which are not directly subject to the will

Although one vawning does not present a very agreeable appearance. is very agreeable to himself, for the stretching of the muscles causes a feeling of comforts it acts like massage, and is the most natural gym nastics of the longs imaginable. Dr. Nargeli therefore advises people not to concern themselves with socailed decency, but every morning and evening, and as often as nossible, to exercise the lungs and all the muscles of respiration by yawning and stretching, as many chronic lung troubles may thus be prevent-

Dr. Naegeli orders the patient troubled with too much wax in the ear, accompanied with pain, to yawn often and deeply. The pain will soon disappear. He also, in case of pasal catarrh, inflamation of the palate, sore throat, and ear-ache, orders the patient, as often as possible possible during each dar to yawn from six to ten times successively, and immediately afterward to swallow. The result will be surprising. If one looks upon yawning as natural message for certain organ: he will reach a satisfactory exidens tion of its curstive properties.


