county government law : Section 1. That Chapter 17 of the first volume of the Code, entitled 'Counties, County Commissioners and County Government," be, and the same and all amendments thereto, are amended as follows: By striking out the words "Justices of the Peace," "with the concurrence of a majority of the Justices of the Peace, sitting with them," "and by a majority of the Justices of the Peace," wherever the same may occur. Sec. 2. By striking out in sub-section 10 all of the same after the word

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
