They ought to be excluded from all fair grounds; and with them excluded there may still be left "inno cent are verments" enough to keep the young people from feeling like the Fair is a dull thing.

Primarily a Fair, such as we hav at the State capital and in the coun ties, contemplates an exhibit of State and county products and resources and to this end the best effort should be given. It is a fine opportunity for any community or county to exhibit to great advantage its products, for whatever is shown worth noticing is sure to be seen and most generally gets into the papers and serves as free advertising.

In this connection the Common-WEALTH hopes that there will be in nocent amusement enough at Weldon Fair next week for all to enjoy. but we hope the outright gamblers and openly indecent people will be kept out.

It is well enough, however, for all to remember that you stand a poor chance anywhere playing with a sharper and a stranger at his own game.


