At the meeting of the executive committee of the Southern Cotton Asociation at Asheville September 6th, 11 cents was fixed as a minimum price for cotton this season.

At a meeting of the State Southern Cotton Association in Raleigh Friday night, October 20th, Dr. R. H. Speight, of Edgecombe, offered a resolution reciting that the minimum price of 11 cents fixed by the Association at Ash ville was reasonable; and urged farmers to stand by it. The resolution was unanimously adopted by a rising vote. Every indication points to almost a certainty that the cotton croft this year will not be more than eleven million bales. 
