

FABRIC OF FALSEHOOD

Governor Kilchin Refutes Assertions of Whiskey Interests.

Governor Kitchin yesterday received an urgent letter from Mr. S. P. Meads, of Oakland, Cal., a leading temperance worker of that State, and prominent in the Anti-Saloon movement in California, stating many criticisms, the operation of prohibition law in North Carolina which had been spread broadcast by the whiskey interests there. An expression from Governor Kitchin, giving a statement of the true condition in North Carolina, was desired, to be read first before the California Anti-Saloon League in State Convention assembled. and also to be published in advancement of the temperance movement in that State. "Your letter of the 22 of January, in which you ask me for information concerning the following charges which you say the liquor men of your Statemake against the prohibition law in North Carolina, has been received, and I answer as follows:

"As to non-enforcement: I know of no case in which the law has not been have been convicted. "As to disrespect for law: There good. is epposition to it, but I think no disrespect except by those who violate it. If there is any other disrespect t is confined to those who oppose it and who wish to encourage efforts toward its repeal.

"As to the liquor sold: There is far diminating violation of this law. Whether there is increased consumption of injurious drugs, I have no information. As to bankruptcy in cites and towns, there is not a word of cruth in this. On the contrary, our towns like Gastonia, Durham, High which had local prohibition beforethe adoption of our State prohibition law are among the most presperous, if not the most prosperous towns in the State. As to increased taxes, it is probable that some few communities, owing to the failure to receive high taxes from the sale of whiskey, are compelled to collect more money from other sources. But the tax rate in the State at large has not increas-

"As to decreased business: There has been no decrease in business of any kind except the whiskey business. Our towns and our State, including the country districts are on the upward grade, developing their resouress, increasing in wealth, building school houses and churches, and going forward in every line which would gratify a good citizen and a patriot.

"As to corruption of officials: I know of no corruption whatever of officials, and believe there is no truth in that charge. If any it is not attributable to prohibition.

"As to social hyprocrisy: There is no more social hyprocrisy than heretofore; no more in prohibition territay than in open saloon territory,



The Historical Jesus.

Unfortunately, the Vandals and Huns who looted the Mediterranean cities burned many of the libraries. All books of that time were written either on antelope skin or papyrus. What with dampness and rough handling, incident to the round rolls, the ordinary book lasted scarcely more than one lifetime, while the vellum was too expensive for ordinary use. For that reason, our faith in the writing of Caesar and Cicero rests on a very slender thread.
