





Scuppernong Grapes.

The North Carolina Experiment Station has just issued a very important Bulletin on "Self-Sterility of the Scuppernong and other Muscadine Grapes." The results reported in this Bulletin show conclusively that these grapes are self-sterile. that is, will not produce normal fruit unless fertilized by pollen from male grape vines. These results were obtained by (1) covering the branches during the blooming season, (2) a study of the germinating flower of the pollen, (3) microscopic study of the dry pollen, (4) examination o the structure of the flowers, and (5)

The second part of the Bulletin discusses the application of these re sults. It deals with the kinds of male vines to plant, where to plant them for best results, and the number of such vines required in a vineyard. weather and pruning have on the subjects treated is dealing with the growing of these grapes from seeds.
