Radium Rays.

The earth travels in its orbit round the sun 19 miles a second. The sun itself, like all the other stars, has its own proper motion through space. Some authorities have calculated its speed at 12 miles a second. A few stars move more slowly than this, others much more rapidly. Arcturus maintains a speed of not less than 100 miles a second, and the star called "Groombridge 1830" travels 150 miles in the same brief

But the speeds of the heavenly bodies are slow compared with the motions of the tiniest known particles of matter. The sun would seem to stand still could we compare its velocity with that of the radium "rays." These radiations are produced by successive explosions of tiny groups of the tiny atoms of radium. The "alpha rays," being themselves infinitesimal fragments of matter, are thrown out while a velocity of perhaps 12,000 miles a second. The "beta rays" travel still faster.

In the emanations of this wonderful radium we find the highest known speed of matter in motion.
