Reduction in Cost.

Mr. William Gray, who had been in bad health for several months, died at the home of his brother, Mr. Thomas F. Gray, on Main street, Wednesday afternoon of last week between five and six o'clock, and the body was taken Thursday to the family home burying ground, several miles in the country, and interred, Rev. N. C. Yearby, pastor of the Methodist church, conducting the services.

Mr. Gray was one of the town's oldest citizens, being a little more than 80 years of age. He is survived by one brother, two sisters and several near relatives. He was a gallant Confederate soldier, and was engaged in many sharp battles during the civil war.
