CLAUDE KITCHIN IS THE MAN.

The Raleigh News and Observer of Sunday contained the following editorial, which we endorse and publish with pleasure. The Observer says:

'In Representative Claude Kitchin there is in Congress a man who has taken a position as a leader in the cause of the people, and that he is one of North Carolina's representatives in that body has been one of the means of giving to this State a commanding position in national legislation. 




