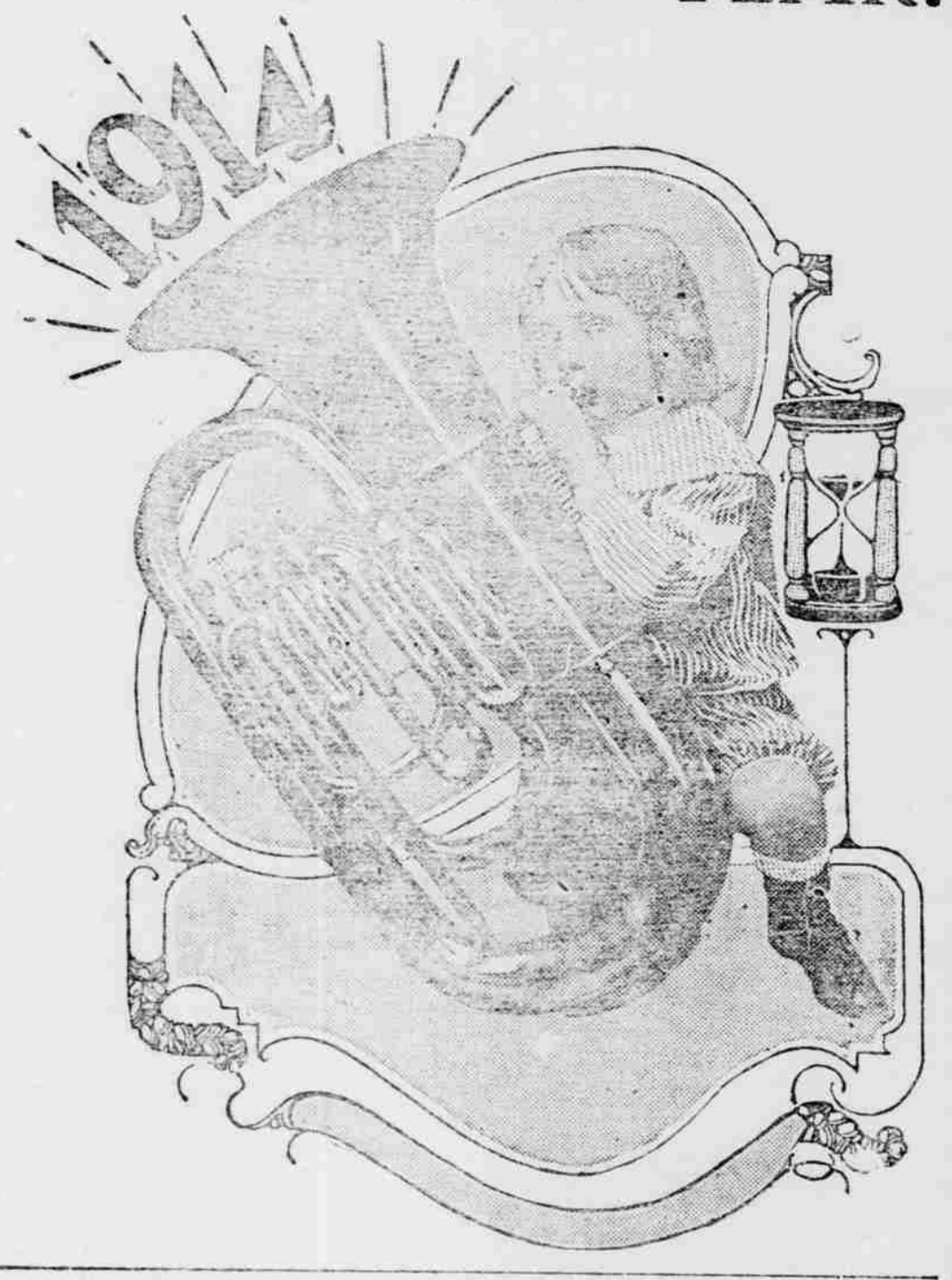

WILDEST YEAR SINCE THE WAR

North Carolina Farmers Are Wealthy More in 1913 by Several Millions Dollars.

Washington, Dec. 23.—North Carolina farmers are richer by several millions of dollars at the close of the year.

According to the bulletin, based on prices of December 1, the following amounts were received for crops in North Carolina:

Wheat, \$7,503,000 against \$5,907,000.

Cotton, \$45,959,000 against \$50,378,000.

Tobacco, \$30,988,000 against \$17,757,000.

From the above figures it will be seen that cotton was the only crop that decreased in value, while tobacco almost doubled in price, and the corn crop was worth nearly three million dollars more than the cotton crop.

REBUKE FOR HOUSE LEADER

Carolina Delegation Endorses His Place Underwood Now Holds.

Washington, D. C., Dec. 23.—All of the members of the North Carolina delegation in the House of Representatives except Representative Claude Kitchin met Saturday and drew up the following letter, which they signed and sent to him as an assurance of their support in his candidacy to succeed Chairman Underwood of the ways and means committee as Democratic leader in the event of Mr. Underwood's election to the Senate.

"Washington, Dec. 23, 1913. Hon. Claude Kitchin, House of Representatives: Dear Sir:—If a vacancy should occur in the position of chairman of the committee on ways and means of the House of Representatives, by the election of Underwood to the Senate, or for other cause your colleagues in the House from North Carolina wish in this personal and public manner to express the hope that you may be elected to fill the vacancy. We shall gladly aid in your election as chairman of this important committee.

"In addition to such personal reasons as may actuate us, we are further impelled by the desire to maintain a homogenous delegation and to enhance the prestige and influence of our State in the Congress.
