RUMANIANS LOSE FORTRESS TO THE BULGO-GERMANS

Paris, Sept. 7.—The French have captured the German first line trenches over a front of one mile on the Verdun front, the war office announced today.

The breach in the German line was effected on the front northpast of Verdun between the Vaux-Chapitre region and the Cheuois. The French took two hundred and fifty prisoners.

The French statement adds that a powerful effort made by German troops to distodge the French from Hospital farm on the Somme front, was without success, and that the Germans were dispersed with heavy losses.
