Masaryk is one of the most interesting figures in the Slav political and scientific world. As a leader of the progressives in the Reichsrath he was forever demanding liberation of the Czech nation from Austrian domination. The outbreak of the war made things very uncomfortable for the professor in Austria so he left.

He had organized and led the opposition to Austria's annexation of Bosnia and Herzegovina.

N. C. GET MONEY FOR ROADS AND TRAILS

WASHINGTON, Jan. 12.—Secretary Houston has announced the amount allotted to each State from the million dollars to be spent during the fiscal year 1918 in constructing roads and trails within or partly within the National Forests. This money is part of the ten million dollars appropriated by the Federal Aid Road Act to assist development of the National Forests, which becomes available at the rate of a million dollars a year for ten years.

The allotments as approved are as follows: Alaska, \$16,354; Arizona, \$58,604; Arkansas, \$9,803; California, \$140,988; Colorado, \$62,575; Idaho, \$108,730; Montana, \$70,042; Nevada, \$19,296; New Mexico, \$42,495; Oregon, \$128,111; South Dakota, \$8,092; Utah, \$41,167; Washington, \$91,944; Wyoming, \$40,684. A total of \$9,995 has been allotted to Florida, Michigan, Minnesota, Nebraska, North Dakota, and Oklahoma. The group of Eastern States—Georgia, Maine, New Hampshire, North and South Carolina, Tennessee, Virginia, and West Virginia—in which the government is purchasing lands for National Forests, receives \$21,120.

In making allotments, it is explained ten per cent of the amount available for 1917 is withheld as a contingent fund. One-half of the remainder has been apportioned among the States in amounts based on the area of the National Forest lands in each State, while the other half has been allotted on a basis of the estimated value of the timber and forage resources which the forests contain.
