## OUR CASUALTIES

Washington, Jan 10.—With a total of 460 names in two lists issued today by the War Department there appears twenty one from North Carolina, as follows

Privates John I. Love, of Concord; Charles R. Snow, of Mount Airy; Willie M. Turner, of Wilmington, and James C. Isaacs, of Dobson were all killed in action.

Private Elijah Milliken, of Rocky Mountain died of disease.

The following were wounded severely: Lieutenant Eli Warlick of Newton; Sergeant George H. Talley, of Greensboro; Corporal Frank L. Thomas, of Winston-Salem and Privates Carl McIntosh, of Barnardsville, and John A. Smith, of Ashboro.

Private Andrew Thomas Speigh of Stantonsburg died from accident and other causes.

Privates Randolph D. Florence of Fayetteville and Belvin Hagar of Thomasville were wounded slightly.

Privates Charles R. Evers, of Lumberton; Oscar E. Nelson, of Patterson; Moses Parker, of Wilson; Samuel E. Pyatt, of Nealsville; David D. Turner, of Wilson; Alenzo L. Williams, of Bailey; and Ellis Tyner, of Buies all were killed in action but were previously reported as missing in action.

Private Tell W. Roos, of Sanford who was previously reported as missing in action has now returned to duty.
