The Department of Agriculture estimates that the world is short (4) million bales of cotton under normal conditions. Under actual conditions the world is probably short one million bales and as the different countries are allowed to take raw materials the demand will increase.

Germany and Austria are not allowed to buy cotton, but these restrictions will shortly be lifted gradually and immediately prices | will rise. Germany and Austria have not as much as a single pound on hand. Their annual requirement under normal conditions are (3) million bales, they will need reserve stock to keep mills running, (1) million bales or a total of (4) million bales. So that when this demand starts something will be sure to happen.

The South has only to sit steady in the boat for a month or two llonger before she enters a period of great prosperity, provided the cotton farmer "HOLDS AND UTS."


