The world is short of cotton and you can get this price if you will not rush your cotton to market. It means thousands of dollars in your pockets. Cotton mills will soon be forced to go into the market to supply their needs. The American Cotton Association asks you to help the cause by not selling for less than 36½c. in October, and increase the price half a cent a month from now on.
The cotton crop is short and there is a bigger demand for cotton goods than in many years. The farmers deserve more than the cost of production for his crop, and they get a fair price for cotton if he will only stick together and hold cotton off the market now.

ORGANIZE COTTON WAREHOUSES

The American Cotton Association furnishes the organization through which cotton warehouses may be established in every cotton growing community, either under the Federal or State plan. Join the Association and help get enough warehouses to store all the cotton produced in the County.

When you store cotton in a State warehouse you can take the cotton receipt and get money with which to tide you over until the price is right, and you want to sell. Warehouses will keep the cotton in the farmer's hands, and keep it out of Wall street speculators.

Talk it over with your neighbors and your business friends, your merchant and your banker.

HELP PROSPERITY TO STAY WITH

It is now or never with the cotton farmer and the business men of the South. We are prosperous this year, and have the money to organize to maintain a fair price for cotton.

You, who remember the days of six cent cotton! Do you want to see a return of those days? They will surely come unless we take steps to prevent their return. The only way to do this is to organize and work together for a fair price for cotton.

Everybody who has handled cotton has made money out of it—that is everybody except the farmer. If the farmer and his real friends stick together now, if they join the American Cotton Association and help in its work, we can invite prosperity to make her home in the South and the invitation will be accepted.
