FEW TOOLS NEEDED FOR THE HOME GARDEN

There are anumber of other tools barrow, that may often be used to the best of my knowledge and beto advantage, but they ore not absolutely necessary.

It is important, however, that the few essential tools be properly cared for and frequently. Every time they are used they should be cleaned and stored in a dry place. Also, they should be kept sharp so that the work may be My Commission expir's March 17th. done easily and thoroughly. A good job of hoeing can not be done with a dull or rusty hoe.

If the garden is located at a distance from the house, a small, low, flat toolbox, long enough to accomodate the hoe and rake, should be provided. The top of this box may be covered with a piece of roofing paper to make it waterproof, and a small lock should be provided for safety. The loss of one good tool will more than offset the cost of a toolbox of this character.
