SCOT NECK-HOBGOOD WINS TWO STRAIGHTS

Taking the big end of the score yesterday both in the game with Pinetops and Williamston. Scotland Neck-Hobgood forged to the head in the Eastern Carolina League.

Bunching hits in the final frame and receiving two walks in that same inning Scotland Neck-Hobgood pushed six men around the bases for tallie winning by a nine to 8 score.

The hitting of both teams coupled with numerous errors caused a slow and uninteresting game. Shields pitching for Scotland Neck-Hobgood while allowing eleven hits kept them well scattered until the ninth frame when Pinetops scored four hits against him, two of them for extra bases. For the locals Leggett lead in batting lonars getting three hits out of four trips to the plate.

Langley, for Pinetops scored the only home run of the game hitting for a complete circuit in the second inning.

Playing in excellent form the locals won their second victory for yesterday by shutting out Williamston on the Hobgood grounds to a 7 to 0 score. The batting of the Hyphenated aggregation, bunching hits at the most opportune moments is chiefly responsible for the victory of the Scotland Club. Crumpler for the home club, pitched excellent ball allowing only five scattered hits to the visiting lads and keeping the home base out of danger with the exception of two innings. Only thirty two men faced him during the whole nine frames. Pettway lead in the batting with four and Leftwich followed with three singles out of four trips to the plate. The pitching of Crumpler for the home aggregation was the outstanding feature of the game. Cox was knocked out in the 5th. Jones as his relief, held the locals to 2 hits in the last four frames.

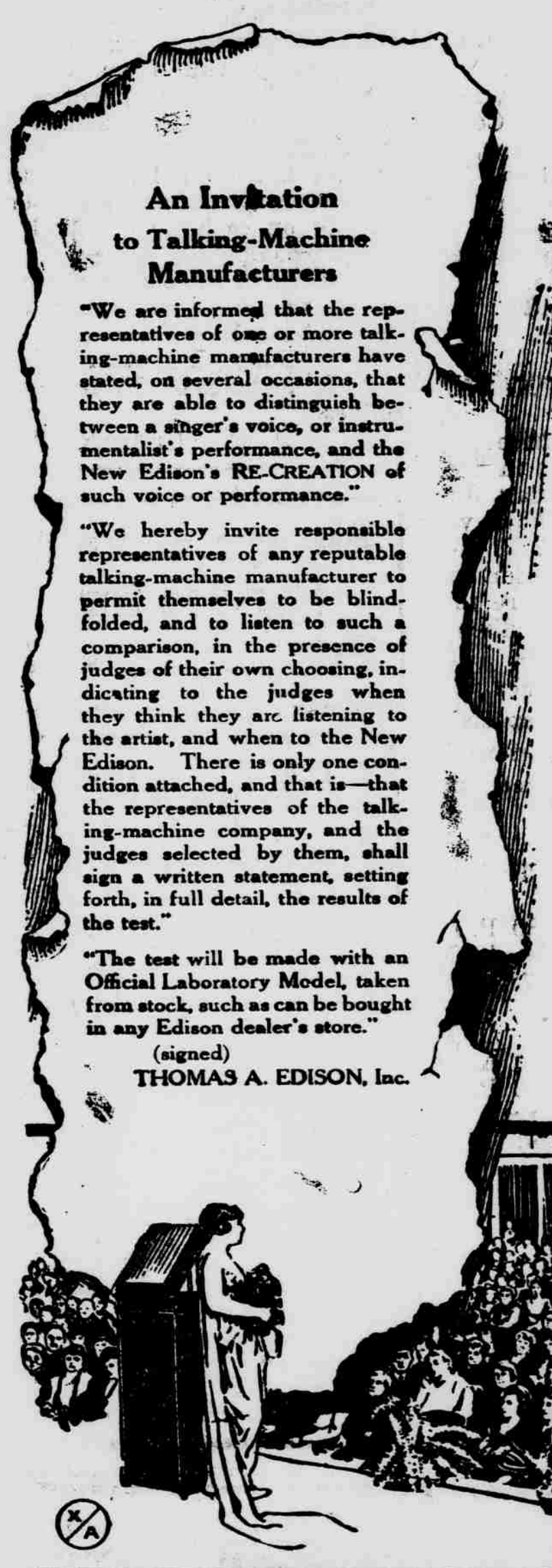

"Six Days Shalt Thou Labor And Do All Thy Work"

The same God who laid upon the children of Israel the injunction to observe the sanctity of the Sabbath proclaimed also the holiness of toil and declared that labor is the law of salvation. In this crucial period of human history it behooves us all to give heed not to one-seventh of this commandment only, but to the six-sevenths with which the Almighty glorified toil and translated work into a form of worship.

There is nothing in this commandment that we of the present day are warranted in interpreting as Divine Sanction for shorter hours or artificial restriction of production. "Six days shalt thou labor"—not six hours a day, not even eight hours a day, but so many hours as may be required to do all thy work.
