

**AGRICULTURAL DEPARTMENT HEARINGS**

(By U. S. Press.)  
Washington, Nov. 4.—A public hearing at Chicago on November 17, will be held by the United States Department of Agriculture for the purpose of discussing questions arising in connection with the designation of future exchanges as contract markets, in accordance with the recently enacted future trading law. Representatives of interested exchanges and the cash grain interests

concerned in the operation of the future exchanges, together with organizations of grain producers, grain dealers and any others concerned in their operation have been invited to be present and to submit their views. Secretary Wallace may attend the meeting.  
Hearings on tentative regulations governing stockyards, commission men and other marketing agencies operating at the stockyards, whose transactions, coming within the provisions of the Packers and Stockyards Act, are soon to be under the supervision of the United States Department of Agriculture, are to be held as follows:

Portland, Oregon, November 7; Denver, Colorado, November 12; Fort Worth, Texas, November 14; Kansas City, Missouri, November 15; Chicago, Illinois, November 18. At these hearings of persons, firms and organizations interested in the proposed regulations and their suggestions and criticism of the measures are invited.
