My dear Sir:  
On my return to the office this morning I find your very kind letter with regard to civic improvement work in your town. I am tremendously interested in this sort of thing, and shall certainly give myself the pleasure of paying you a visit soon. I can not just at this time name a definite date. I have just returned from Wilmington and looked over a good deal of tree planting there, which I did as chairman of the Tree and Park Commission.

I thank you for the picture which shows how the street and sidewalk plazas have been arranged. This arrangement can not be improved upon. It will be very pretty to have a complete row of crepe myrtle down the center part, so that from the first of June until frost you will have a lovely line of pink blooms down the center of the plazas, while water oaks, laurel oaks, or some other tree which is well adapted to be planted along the sidewalk plazas on either side. There could also be planted in the center plaza some shrubs which bloom very early such as the Japanese magnolia. If the japonicas bloom in that section, one could have these during December and January.

However, I shall certainly pay you a visit very soon and talk over with you these matters in detail.

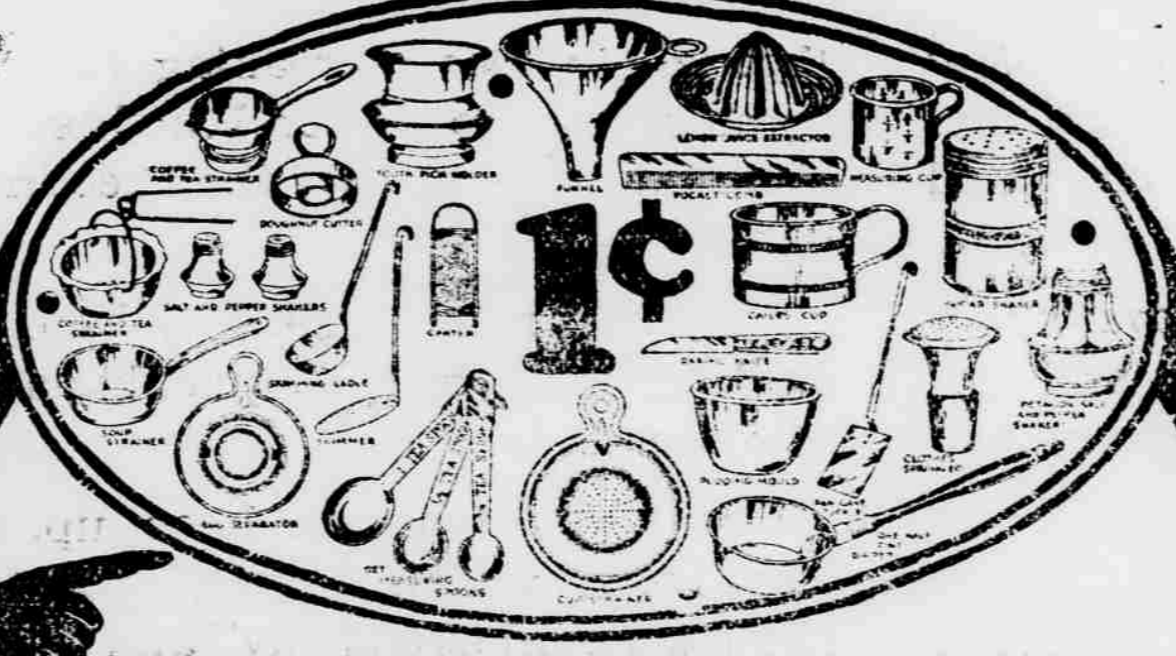
