BIBLE THOUGHT FOR TODAY

A SAFE FORTRESS.—As the
mountains are round about Jeru-
salem, so the Lord is round about
his people from henceforth even
for ever.—Psalm 125: 2.

It is deplorable that employers
and employees cannot settle their
differences without resort to
violence, entailing great loss of
life and property, which inevit-
ably results in developing deep
feeling between all parties, ex-
tending even to those not direct-
ly interested. Already the coal
strike has taken a considerable
toll of human life, and develop-
ments in the rail strike look as
if that also will result in untold
casualties. Violence never ac-
complishes anything, but serves
only to develop a more determi-
ned attitude on the part of
those against whom it is direct-
ed.

Sane council always prevails
in the end and we trust it will
do so in the case of the rail strike
before it develops any consider-
able violence or loss of life.

CONTEMPTABLE ATTITUDE

In a recent speech, General
Sawyer, "peace-time brigadier"
and personal physician to the
President, referred to disabled
and maimed soldiers of the
World War as those who "re-
turned more or less dependent
upon the charitable disposition
of the great government in
whose defense they enlisted,"—
and this coming from a man
who has charge of the hospital-
ization of the hundreds of thou-
sands of suffering, wounded
soldiers. No wonder there is a
hue and cry from one end of the
country to the other against the
treatment which these men are

receiving.

No more contemptable expres-
sion ever emanated from any
man in any official position than
that of this "peace-time brig-
adier" in referring to these men
as being "dependent upon the
charitable disposition of the gov-
ernment for which they fought."
It is an insult to every man who
wore a uniform to dub such a
man brigadier general, peace
time officer though he be, and
a further disgrace and shame
that he should have in charge
the hospitalization of those men
who sacrificed their all in de-
fence of what he terms a "char-
itable government."

The government has been gen-
erous enough in its provisions
for those men, but the selection
of those to administer the funds
has been lamentably faulty, and
the men have not received the
treatment which a generous and
appreciative government would
that they should have.

Common decency, if no other
reason, should require that these
men be spoken of and referred
to with respect, and not as
"charity patients" crawling on
bended knee begging the gov-
ernment for which they fought
for the means of sustenance. No
decent, patriotic American will
approve of such expressions as
the unworthy "brigadier" gave
voice to, and such a man should
be removed even from his "peace
time" rank and semi-official po-
sition. He is a disgrace to the
uniform which he wears and to
the government which he is sup-
posed to serve.
