### A Black Man's Funeral at the South.

The Atlanta papers announced, some days ago, that a colored man had been buried in the Baptist Church, in that city. What Andrew Marshall was to Savannah, Kelly Low was to Augusta. We copy the following account of his funeral, in which a large portion of the white population participated from the *True Democrat* of Tuesday:

Circumstances beyond our control have prevented us from giving full details of the death of Kelly Low, colored pastor of Springfield Baptist Church. This event is deeply regretted by all classes and conditions of persons in our community, took place on the 2d inst., at his residence, in this city. In 1852 he was ordained a Minister of the Gospel, and from that time to his death, he has been constant, zealous and efficient in his labors.

In addition to his regular services, he taught in the Sunday school, and was a member of the colored Masonic Lodge.

The number of the latter in procession has been estimated from 1,000 to 1,500, and the number in attendance at the grave, in the church yard, was not less than 4,000 persons.

We forbear any comments of our own, upon the character of the deceased, and give place to the following tribute from his former owner, one of our most intelligent and prominent citizens. It reflects the sentiments of our entire community:

"From my own knowledge of Kelly Low, I can truly say, that he was no ordinary man in intelligence, and in all that constitutes an honest, truthful and reliable man. He was raised in my family from early boyhood, and was my property for over twenty-five years, and I know him to have been as near a *perfect man* as any other man I ever knew. Indeed, he has always viewed him to be, without spot or blemish, in character and disposition, beginning even in his youth, and continuing up to the day of his death."

"Again!" and the volled peal of nine went up, till we hope, like grateful incense to the almighty Throne, around which evermore cluster the guardian angels, of our country, and from whence the calm, serene, and well-known voice of the South is looking down upon the goodness of her sons, and sorrowing to think that his parting legacy of attachment to his beloved country is so little valued and regarded.

Occupation of the CHATTANOOGA ARSENAL. A private letter received yesterday from Bainbridge, informs us that the occupation of the Chattanooga Arsenal, in the Gadsden, and the junction of the Tennessee and Chattahoochee rivers, by the "Quincy Guards."

The arsenal contains 500,000 rounds of musket cartridges, 300,000 rifle cartridges, and 50,000 pounds of gunpowder. There are no arms, except such as are necessary to defend the property against ordinary contingencies.—*Savannah Republican.*
