#### The Navy of the United States. The numerical force and tonnage, with the number of guns, of the vessels of the navy, is

Of the ten receiving ships the tonnage is 31, osts number of guns 872; ten frigates, 17,262 tons; number of guns 500. Twenty-one sloops of war have a tonnage of 19, 264, with 416 guns. Three brigs have tonnage 763; number of guns 16. Threestore-ships have a tonnage of 1,342, and seven guns. Five permanent store ships have 5,536 tons, with no guns. Seven screw frigates hade a tonnage of 24,660, and 262 guns. Nineteen stream sloops, of first and second class, side wheel and screw, have a tonnage of 27,549, us. Ten third class steamers have a toanage of 6,111 tons, and 40 guns, and 2 screw tenders have 590 tons, and 4 guns. Lastly come Stevens' war steamer of 4683 tons, and six guns The total number of vessels in the United States naval service is 91, which have a tonnage of 119,791, and 2,319 guns. .

There are nine navy yards and two store sta-The navy vards are at Portsmouth, N. H. Mass.; Brooklyn, New York; Philadelphia, Pa.; Baltimore, Md.; Washington, D. C; Norfolk, Va.; Pensacola, Florida; San Francisco, California; and Sackett's Harbor, N. C. The store ship stations are at Valparaiso and Panama. Last year the navy cost \$14,078,529 04 for its support. There are in the navy 98 captains, 100 commanders, 360 lieutenants, 143 surveyors, 64 parsons! 22 chaplains, 11 professors of mathema-

tics, 45 masters, 2 passed midshipmen, 50 midshimen. 42 boatswains, 46 gunners, 46 carpenters, 42 sailmakers, 175 engicers, 238 pupils at the Annapolis Academy, and about 7,500 seamen. The marine corps includes one colonel, with brevet rant of brigadier-general an adjutant, paymaster and two quartermasters. There are Iso one lieutenant colonel, four majors, thirteen captains, twenty first lieutenants, and twenty second lieutenants. The non-commissioned officers and privates number about twelve hun-

dred men!

SPIKING CANNON,-There is no method of spiking a cannon which will forever prevent its ase. If the spike is made of iron or of unhardened steel. It may be removed by the drill. If it powder placed in the bottom of the bore. But f the spike is made of hardened steel, to fit the vent closely, and is driven in with great force : and if its lower end is made soft, and riveted within the sore, then neither the drill nor gunpowder can remove it; the vent remains perfectly closed. The remedy in such cases is to drill a new vent, which may be done without impairing the serviceableness of the gun. A new vent may be drilled in any cannon, by a skillful

machinist, in two or three hours, In experimental firing, when a vent becomes too much worn and enlarged, we drill a new one. and sometimes as many as three or four vents are made in the same gun, and many hundred fires are made (Herwards. During the recent Crimean war, an article rela-

tive to the wiking of cannon was published in the London Times, in which it was asserted that the use of a new 'patent spike' would destroy the serviceabliness of the gun, The spike was lescribed as a piece of finely tempered steel, turned to at the vent, but to move freely in it, and turning out in a forked spring in the bore. This spike it was alleged, could not be removed, as it would turn readily with the drill, but it seems that the possibility of cutting or breaking off the tomes or forks of the spring inside the barrel was no considered.
