THE SUPREME COURT.

The Supreme Court of North Carolina is held at Raleigh semi-annually, on the second Monday in June, and the 2d Monday in December. It is also held twice a year at Morganton, on the 1st Monday in August, J. R. Dodge, Clerk. The officers are as follows: Chief Justice, Richmond C. Pearson, of Yadkin; Justices, M. E. Manly of Craven, and William H. Battle, of Orange—salary of each, 2,500 per annum. William A. Jenkins, of Wake, Attorney General; James C. Johnston, of Rowan, Clerk of the Court; F. Freeman, of Wake, Clerk; Oliver H. Perry, of Wake, Deputy Clerk; James Littleford, of Wake, Marshal.
