Judges—Hon. J. M. Wayne, of Georgia; Hon. Asa Biggs, of Martin, District Judge—Solary \$3000.  
Robert P. Dick, District Attorney; Wesley Jones, Marshal.

The United States District Courts are held at Raleigh semi-annually in April and October, J. M. Jones, Clerk; Newbern, 4th Monday in April and October, Benjamin Brown, Clerk; Wilmington, 1st Monday after the 4th day in April and October, John L. Cantwell, Clerk.

**THE SUPREME COURT.**  
The Supreme Court of North Carolina is held at Raleigh semi-annually on the second Monday in June, and the 2d Monday in December. It is also held once a year at Morganton, Burke county, on the 1st Monday in August, R. D. Dodge, Clerk. The officers are as follows: Chief Justice, Richmond M. Pearson, of Yadkin; Justices, M. E. Manly, of Craven, and William H. Battle, of Wayne;—salary of each, \$3,000 per annum. William A. Jenkins, of Warrenton, Attorney General; Hamilton C. Jones, of Rowan, Reporter; Edmund R. Eason, of Hines, Editor of the Court; W. A. Wake, Deputy Clerk; James Littlefield, of Wake, Marshal.
