good people of the State of North Carolina are restored to the full enjoyment and exercise of the rights and privileges secured to them by the Constitution of the United States

Resolved, That a copy of these resolutions, duly authenticated, be sent to the President of the United States, and to the Provisional Governor of this State.

Mr. Logan, resolutions that the Convention will consider only at its present session, such amendments to the Constitution of the State as shall be deemed sufficient to restore us to our former relations in the Union : that the Convention will legislate only on such subjects as are necessary to put into full operation the civil authority, upon the cessation of the Provisional government; and further, that the Convention adjourn on Saturday, the 14th inst., to meet again on the first Monday in January next, or sooner, if the Presi dent shall deem it necessary.
