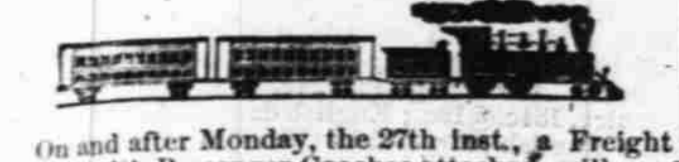

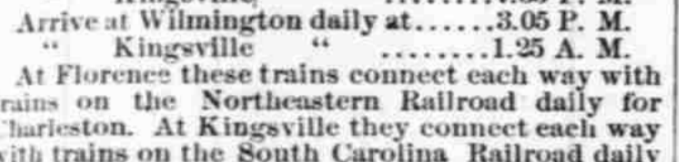

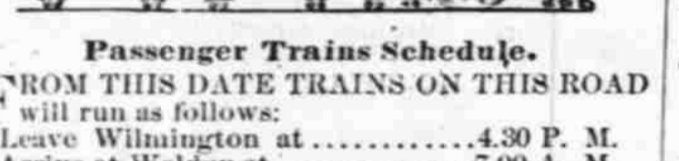

At Florence these trains connect each way
with the Northeastern Railroad daily for
Charleston. At Kingsville they connect each way
with the South Carolina Railroad daily for
Columbia and Augusta. In going to Columbia,
passengers stage from Hopkin's Turnout, on
south Carolina Railroad, to Columbia, a dis-
tance of twelve miles. In going to Augusta, they
stage from Orangeburg on South Carolina R. R.,
to Johnston's Turnout, on South Carolina R. R.,
a distance of fifty-two miles. At Florence these
trains connect with Cheraw and Darlington Rail-
road, which road runs up to Cheraw Tuesdays,
Thursdays and Saturdays, and down from Cheraw
to Florence every Monday, Wednesday and Fri-
day. There is daily stage communication from
Sumter, S. C., to Camden, S. C., connecting with
these trains. The steamer connecting with these
trains arrives and departs from the Wilmington
and Weldon Railroad at wharf. The freight office
of the Company is for the present on Water
street, at the wharf formerly used by steamer
North Carolina, running to Fayetteville. The
office of the President, General Superintendent
