THE RIOT IN NEW ORLEANS.

Martial Law Revoked-More Lawless-ness-Incendiary Radical Speeches.

The following additional facts in relation to the late unfortunate riot and loss of life in New Orleans, have been received; NEW ORLEANS, Aug. 2.

The order declaring martial law has been withdrawn, Judge Abell has charged the grand jury to indict all persons engaged in the recent riot. Several arrests have already been made, and all the prisoners released by the military will be rearrested. The military commission for an investigation of the riot has been in session to-day, and taken the testimony of the policemen.

A street car was fired into in the outskirts of the city last night by negroes, and Capt. Charles Reynolds, of the steamer Starlight, was killed. One of his murderers has been arrested. Many arrests of armed blacks have been made since the riot. Several houses occupied by negroes have been discovered containing arms and ammunition.

THE ORIGIN OF THE OUTBREAK. The New Orleans Commercial of the 28th contains a report of the meeting of the white men and negroes in front of the Mechanic's Institute, in that city, the evening previous, in-favor of universal suffrage and to back up the convention to assemble next day.
