Congregation of Sovereigns—Sketches of Distinguished Personages. Looking at the extraordinary re-union of sovereigns and princes in Paris, attracted by the Great Exposition, it may not be inopportune to give a short memorandum and observations touching those illustrious personages who are now or recently were in the French capital.

Leopold II, King of the Belgians, is thirty-two years of age, and was crowned on the 10th of December, 1835. He is the grand son, on his mother's side, of King Louis Philippe, and married in 1835 an archduchess of Austria, Henrietta Anne, daughter of the Archduke Joseph.

George I, King of Greece, son of the King of Denmark, and brother-in-law of the Prince of Wales, is only twenty-two years of age. He is a fine young man, of fair complexion, thin and somewhat pale; of elegant deportment and very distinguished manners.
