

that Congress reserves to itself full and unres-tricted right of judgement whenever a State presents, itself for admission into the Union .-That right will exercised fairly and generously even, but yet in the interest of peace and loyalty.

Certain conditions precedent are laid down in the laws. These must be met; but beyond these conditions Congress must be satisfied also that the people of the proposed States, respectively, are and and likly to be loyal to the Union by deare and and fixty to be loyal to the Union by de-cisive and trustworthy majorities; that the in-stitutions are framed upon the basis of equality, and that they will from year to year and from age to age contribute to the peace, progress, and

prosperity of the State and of the country. If the people of the States lately in rebelion shall cheerfully and in good faith reorganize their governments upon the principles of the laws passed by Congress, there will then remasn no causes of difference between the various sections of the country. The Republican party is hostile to slavery and opposed to its spirit and purposes. If the spirit of slavery is permitted to control the institutions and civilization of the South, there can be no restoration of the Union in fact If there should be in name. The restoration of the Union means the establishment of those relations of friendship between the States of the North and of the South which now subsist bat-ween the States of the North. When that mo-

ween the States of the North. When that mo-ment arrives, as it will soon arrive, if the pur-poses of Congress are met in a proper spirit by the people of the South, the nation will at once employ its immense resonsoes and power for the developement of that region of the country, and in a short period of time not only will the evi-dences of war have disapproved, but the reor-ganized States will be in the enjoyment of a de-gree of prosperity not before experienced. There can be restoration, conciliation, friend-ship, and prosperity for all, if the States lately in rebellion rebuild their institutions upon the principles of justice; but if they dwell upon the past, revive and strengthen the hatreds that were engendered by the contest about slavery, if they deya land, education, or equality of rights in any particular to any class of their citizens, then, in some degree, the malign influences of the past and the present will be transmitted to the future.
