I. All persons appointed to office in this Mili-tary District, under any authority, civil or mili-tary, from and after July 19, 1867, shall be re-quired, in addition to the oath of office required quired, in addition to the oath of office required by municipal or other regulation, to take and subscribe before a Notary Public, Magistrate, or other officer authorized to administer oaths, the oath of office prescribed by iaw for officers of the United States. A copy of the oath, duly sub-scribed and attested, shall be filed with the Com-manding Officer of the Military Post Blank torms of the prescribed oath will be furnished on application to the Post Commander. II. All appointments made by municipal, town or county authoritres, being provisional only, will be reported to the Commanding officer of the Military Post within which they are made, who will forward the same, with his recommen-dation, to these Headquarters.
