CONVENTION STAY LAW.

HEADQUARTERS SECOND MILITARY DISTRICT, CHARLESTON, S. C. April 2, 1868. GENERAL ORDERS, No. 57. The Ordinance of the Constitutional Convention of the State of North Carolina, convened in conformity with the Act of Congress of March 23, 1867, supplementary to the Act of March 2, 1867, "to provide for the more efficient government of the rebel States," entitled "An Ordinance respecting the jurisdiction of the courts of this State," which was ratified in said Convention on the 17th day of March, 1868, and which is hereby published, is hereby approved, and will have the force of law in said State until the question of the ratification or rejection of the Constitution framed by said Convention, by the people of said State, shall have been determined by an election held in the manner prescribed by law...

AN ORDINANCE RESPECTING THE JURISDICTION OF THE COURTS OF THIS STATE.

SECTION 1. Be it ordained by the people of North Carolina in Convention assembled, That sections 1 and 2 of the ordinance of the Convention, adopted June 23, 1866, entitled, "An Ordinance to change the jurisdiction of the courts and the rules of pleading therein," be and are hereby repealed. SECTION 2. Be it further ordained, That Section 3 of the above entitled Ordinance be amended to read as follows: SECTION 3. Be it further ordained, That Section 10 of the above recited Act shall be amended to read as follows: SECTION 10. That the executions on judgments in action of debt, assumpsit, covenant or account, or decrees for money demands in Equity, which have been or shall be issued on judgments or decrees, heretofore obtained, shall be levied on the property of the defendant, and returned without sale: Provided, such return shall not prejudice any lien the plaintiff may acquire or then have by virtue of said lien, or rendition of process.
