Office of City Clerk & Treasurer, CITY OF WILMINGTON, N. C. June 24th, 1875. AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING COWS AND OTHER CATTLE running at large.

Section 1st. That any cow, or other cattle of any kind, found running at large, within the corporate limits of this city, shall be impounded by the City Marshal and the owner required to pay a fine of Ten (10) dollars before the same shall be released.

Section 2d. Any ordinance or parts thereof, conflicting herewith, are hereby repealed. The above ordinance was adopted by the Board of Aldermen on the 25th day of June 1875—and will go into effect, on and after Monday June 28th 1875.
