STOLEN PROPERTY RECOVERED.—CAPTURE OF THE THIEVES.

Two colored men, by the name of John Jackson and Curley Porter, were arrested on Thursday of last week on the charge of stealing a lot of jewelry from Mr. S. R. Bell.

The way the discovery was made: On Wednesday evening, August 29th, a colored man called at a business house on South Water street and offered some jewelry for sale, fixing his price at \$3.

The articles were worth more than that and the proprietor of the establishment, suspecting something wrong, offered to pay him 75 cents then and the remaining \$2 25 the next morning.

Soon after the above transpired an officer was put on the track of the two men, and finally came across Jno. Jackson at the corner of Fourth and Brunswick streets, when he was arrested.

The jewelry in question was identified by Mr. Bell as a portion of that stolen from his residence.

After the arrest of John Jackson and Curley Porter, search warrants were issued and placed in the hands of Officer Davis, of the police force, who, accompanied by Mr. Bell and others, visited a house on Market, between Thirteenth and Fourteenth streets, occupied by Curley Porter.
