EXPLANATION OF DISTRIBUTION.

The numbers from 1 to 10,000, corresponding with the Certificates, are printed on separate slips of paper, and encircled with small tin tubes, and placed in one wheel. The 100 awards are printed on slips of paper and encircled with tin tubes, and placed in another wheel. Both wheels are then revolved, and a number is drawn from the wheel of numbers; and at the same time a printed slip of the awards is drawn from the other wheel. The number and award drawn out are opened and exhibited to the spectators, and registered by the Commissioner. The award being placed against the number drawn. This operation is repeated until all the awards are drawn out.
