COTTON CROP SHORT IN ROBESON

Prominent Lumberton Man Estimates Crop to Be But Half of Normal. Lumberton, Oct. 4.—A. W. McLean, one of Lumberton's most prominent citizens and one of the largest cotton growers in the county, estimates the shortage in that crop will result in a loss of over three million dollars to the farmers of Robeson. He estimates that 75,000 bales would have been raised under normal conditions, while present prospects are for a crop of 40,000 bales.
