New York, Oct. 7.—The cotton market was unsettled at today's opening and first prices were higher by 7 points and later declined to 3 points. Overnight selling orders had been brought in by the weaker rulings and December sold off to 17.03, while January declined to 16.94, or about 3 or 4 points net lower, after the call. The market soon steadied and the prices worked 5 to 9 points higher before the end of the first hour, with December selling to 17.12 and January to 17.06.

New York (Wall Street), Oct. 7.—More or less denials of the peace rumors circulated with material effect in yesterday's late dealings resulted in a general rebound of today's trading, although an undercurrent was in evidence. Leading rails, United States Steel and prominent equipments made advances from substantial fractions to almost 2 points. The only notable exceptions were Republic Steel and Motors. Heavy selling followed the advance, but this was partly overcome by a fresh bunch of war issues.

WASTE TANBARK NOW USED TO MAKE ROOFING

Washington, Oct. 7.—A method for using waste hemlock tanbark to partially replace expensive rag stock in the manufacture of felt roofing has been developed at the Forest Products Laboratory and is now being used commercially by cooperating mills, according to announcements made by the Forest Service. It is stated that, in these mills, from 20 to 30 per cent. of the rags is being replaced by waste bark and that the quality of the finished product is equal to that manufactured solely from rags.

WATCH FOR BANDS ON WILD DUCKS. Washington, D. C., Oct. 7.—If you kill or capture a wild duck bearing an aluminum band around, one leg, having a number on one side, and on the other a statement requesting that you notify the United States Department of Agriculture, or the Biological Survey, be notified you are requested to send this band at once to the Bureau of Biological Survey, United States Department of Agriculture, Washington, D. C.
