Peking, Oct. 26.—Because of the late Yuan Shi-kai's espousal of Confucianism and the important part that religion, or philosophy, played in the effort to restore the monarchy, ultra-republican members of parliament recently made an attempt to have Confucianism abolished by legislation on the theory that such action would grant greater freedom of conscience and insure the perpetuity of the republic.

This step aroused great indignation among the modern admirers of Confucius and called forth a shower of protests. Kang Yu-wei, the distinguished scholar, who is among the prominent publicists who oppose the eradication of Confucianism, telegraphed to the central government declaring that the Confucian religion is distinctly the religion of China, and that if it is rejected Chinese would become like brutes.

Premier Tuan Chi-jui replied that the public has great reverence for Confucius, but that this reverence is in the hearts of the public and that it is no longer necessary for them to prostrate their body on the ground to show their respect for China's great sage.

In spite of the efforts of politicians to keep religion out of the political turmoil in China, various religious agitators have been able to intensify the internal troubles of the Chinese republic. China has no State religion, even Shi-kai did not show preference for any particular religion.

Headquarters of the Italian Army, Oct. 26.—That the Boy Scouts of Italy are taken seriously was indicated today by the recent order of the Minister of War calling upon them to do service in the war zone or behind the lines in other military capacities according to their age.

They were mobilized in the same manner as grown-up soldiers, the various sections moving by train from various points in Italy to a central headquarters at a concentration camp to the north of Bologna.
