ARE PLANNING FOR BIG CELEBRATION

President's Message to be Read at Court House Saturday Night—Meeting Tonight

Elaborate preparations are being made for the celebration of Woodrow Wilson Day and a program of a highly interesting and entertaining nature has been prepared and will be carried out at the County Court House tomorrow night, beginning at 8 o'clock. Silver-tongued orators will address on the achievements of Mr. Wilson and a message from the President will be read by Mr. Cyrus D. Hogue, Esq., a member of the Wilmington bar and one of Mr. Wilson's staunchest supporters. Tomorrow night's meeting at the Court House will only be one of hundreds that will be held the country over and the message that will be delivered to the Wilmington audience by Mr. Hogue will be the same as those read elsewhere. Local political leaders are confident that the Court House will be crowded to its fullest capacity because they believe that all will want to hear the message of the "peace President." They are today urging that all attend and help to make the occasion a memorable one.

The open-air meeting which was to have been held at the corner of Fifth and Castle streets last night was postponed because of inclement weather, but it will be held tonight at 8 o'clock and all are urged to attend. Band music will be furnished for the occasion and Secretary Cashwell, of the County Democratic Executive Committee, is urging that all attend. A number of short addresses will be made by the committee on arrangements, which is not giving out anything for publication. Those in charge promise a surprise and add that it will be of an agreeable nature and warn all that if they miss it they will regret it.

Tonight's gathering at the corner of Fifth and Castle will serve as a prelude to tomorrow night's rally at the Court House and officers of the County Democratic Executive Committee and members of the Executive Committee of the Wilson Club are very anxious that everyone attend tonight's rally and Saturday night's celebration.
