He was the son of a hack driver in Tunbridge, England. At the age of 12 he was sent to prison for embezzlement. After serving three years he escaped, only to be arrested two years later and sentenced for robbery. At the age of 18 he stole securities valued at \$80,000, and was sentenced to ten years' penal servitude, but was released on a forged pardon.

While still in England he got into some of the best households as a servant, studied the ways of society and in later years made good use of his studies. He perfected himself in French, German and the classics and was a polished fraud when he arrived in this country in 1891.
