> The Appam crew will make their home with their brothers on the interred German auxiliary cruisers Prinz Eitel Friederich and Kronprinz Wilhelm. They will not be considered a prisoners, it was explained, but merely detained under surveillance.

> Many Aeroplanes Shot Down. Berlin, Feb. 9, via Sayville-The Germans lost 34 airplanes in January and the British, French and Russians 55, the war office announced today.

"The aviators, notwithstanding the sever cold, fulfilled in January their important tasks of observation, reconnoitering and attacking," the statement says. "Last month we lost 34 airplanes. The British, French and Russians lost 55 airplanes in aerial engagements or by being shot down from the gorund. Of these 29 fell beyond our lines, as was seen plainly and 26 are in our possession.

"Mor over three hostile captive balloons were brought down in flames. We lost no balloons."
